COMPTROLLER'S MESSAGE
Faithful Citizenship

As we approach the November election and the choice that we will make for various offices including that of President, I would like to reflect on the ideal of "patriotism" which is associated with all Fourth degree Knights and our call to "Faithful Citizenship." Patriotism is reflective of one who is a proud and loyal supporter of their country and its way of life desiring for their country that which best serves its citizens. As citizens of the United States and as faithful Catholics (a commitment we make as Knights of Columbus), we have a responsibility to bear witness to our faith in allowing that faith to direct and guide our actions as citizens and in the duties associated with citizenship such as our vote.

Two pillars of Catholic social thought, the common good and the dignity of the human person, become our "touchstone" in how we carry out the responsibilities of faithful Catholic citizenship. The common good is "the sum total of social conditions which allow people, either as groups or as individuals, to reach their fulfillment more fully and more easily" (Vatican Council II, Gaudium et Spes, no. 26) and "stems from the dignity, unity and equality of all people... which every aspect of social life must be related if it is to attain its fullest meaning." (Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Catholic Church, no. 164). In speaking about the dignity of the human person, it originates from Sacred Scripture and the first chapter of Genesis in which God created us "in his image and likeness" and that creation is "very good." This bestows upon every human person an inherent and innate dignity which is to be respected, protected, preserved and loved from the moment of conception until natural death in every stage and condition of life.

We are also taught by the Catholic Church that we are to act according to our conscience and, in particular, a conscience that is well formed in which we make the last best judgment about what we ought to do, about what is just and right. With the two pillars of the common good and the dignity of the human person as our foundation, we have the basis by which carry out one of the most critical and important duties as faithful Catholic citizens- our vote. Archbishop Chaput, in his weekly column of October 18th, clearly gives us a barometer in how our vote is to be guided: "if we believe that a particular

We ask that you please comply to this request for the good of the Color Corps so that we may build up that body again to the status it used to be, proudly representing the Cardinal Dougherty Assembly!


